

# Messages From Our Leaders

## FROM THE RABBI'S DESK



Dear Friends,

Do you do anything special on Shabbat with your family or friends?

Honestly, in a dual rabbi household where both Erica and I are running here and there on Jewish holidays (which, of course, includes Shabbat),

we have to be intentional in our planning for Jewish holidays and rituals. And while we don't have the opportunity to have the traditional festive Shabbat meal before running off to lead services, we always make a point of "making Shabbat" with the family by lighting candles, and blessing the wine and challah.

We try to make Saturday as "Shabbat-like" as possible. For us, that means family time. We don't pay bills or do emails. We try to power down as much as we can. A movie in the living room with some popcorn, or a trip to a park, or visiting Erica's family in Jupiter is our style.

(But good luck with trying to keep everyone off social media. That's never going to happen!)

Ahad Ha'am, one of modern Zionism's earliest philosophers, once wrote, "More than the Jews have kept Shabbat, Shabbat has kept the Jews." If there's one thing that has united Jews of all nationalities and cultures is the desire to observe Shabbat as one of God's greatest gifts to the Jewish people. It's what unites us as Jews, and it's what every Jew has in common.

Shabbat makes sense. Even God needed a rest after working so hard. "For in six days God made the heavens and the earth, the sea and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day; therefore God blessed the Sabbath day." (Exodus 20:11)


We need a weekly break, a time to release the tensions of work and the stresses we encounter in our daily lives. Making Shabbat work for you within the context of the Jewish tradition also brings on a sense of gratefulness. It's God's way of telling us to slow down, smell the flowers, and appreciate what you have.

If you haven't done so already, I hope you will consider doing something special for yourself and your family on Shabbat. Consider lighting candles, for instance, and allow yourself to become mesmerized by the glow of the flames. Prepare a special meal and share it with friends or family. Whatever you do to relax, make a point of doing it on Shabbat.

Shabbat is all about taking a break and letting your batteries recharge. It's a remarkable gift God has given us!

## A FEW NOTES FROM OUR CANTOR



This year, the temple choir returned to the bimah during the High Holy Days after years of ongoing pandemic. One of the many things the pandemic made difficult was making music in groups.

Normally when multiple people are talking at once it becomes a cacophonous mess. One of the most amazing parts about singing in a choir is that many voices can sound at once, sometimes even singing different notes, while maintaining balance and harmony. It is a beautiful phenomenon that voices that are so different can come together to sound like one. This is another reason why saying kaddish is so powerful, for many voices come together as one. Being apart for so many years taught us the value

of joining our voices together. While there were ways to communicate both with audio and video conferencing, there was really no technology that would allow musicians to reliably play together. After such a long hiatus, I felt so lucky that our choir was able to embellish the services and help uplift us all.

So much has happened in the last couple years that it may feel like a lifetime. Between the pandemic, the climate crisis, and a general feeling of global unrest, there is no escaping what is broken. During difficult times, it is helpful to tap into what Jewish tradition has to offer. Our familiar words and music bring us close and offer comfort to the uncomfortable. There are heartfelt conversations, connections, and songs which carry us through to repose. The more we can join our voices for a common message, the stronger that message will become. I give tremendous credit to the group of women who sang together at the services this year. I am excited for the future opportunities we will have to join our voices in song.

## A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESCHOOL DIRECTOR



When you are next in the Temple, please find time to walk down the hallways of the preschool. The talents and skills of the children in our school are illustrated through their drawings, photo exposés and literary charts.

The multi-faceted ways we teach the children Jewish Holidays and Jewish values are depicted through their creative expressions. The tradition of eating apples dipped in honey was practiced in September. The creation of graphs illustrating a poll conducted of the children's favorite color apples supplemented that traditional activity. Next, we transformed our dramatic play centers into Sukkahs which the children decorated and created. In preparation for Simchat Torah, the 3's & PreK classes were given an up-close look at the Torah by the Rabbi. Each of the children identified a Hebrew word in the Torah, and the Rabbi translated and explained that word to them. The festive week's activities concluded with Cantor Rachel and the teachers leading a very joyous Simchat Torah parade through the sanctuary.

Our curriculum uses eating in and decorating the Sukkah to transmit longstanding the Jewish traditions of kindness to strangers, respect for others, and welcoming guests. By weaving the religious traditions of Sukkot, Simchat Torah, and the secular holiday of Thanksgiving, our blended curriculum teaches the values of friendship, and generosity while celebrating the unique nature of different people and cultures. The traditional manner of celebrating

these important holidays and the underlying Jewish Values presented in our preschool will be used by the children throughout their lifetimes.

Our lessons about the richness of Thanksgiving are beautifully foreshadowed by the preschool activities for Sukkot. We first harvest, preschool style. The children shuck corn, and plant seeds. Lessons about sharing and tzedakah will be woven into the community-wide food collections for the less fortunate. During the week of Thanksgiving our families are invited to school for our joyous Thanksgiving program. This preschool celebration is shaped by parents and teachers working together to help the children decorate fall holiday costumes and cook special dishes to share.

Our return from the Thanksgiving break will bring more activity. Hanukkah will become the focus. While enjoying the idea of receiving gifts and gelt, all of the children will also experience the joy of sharing and giving. The residents at the Morse Geriatric Center will receive cards made by the older classes. The Ferd and Gladys Alpert Jewish Family Services will be the beneficiaries of our Hanukkah gift drive. A lasting impression is made on young minds and hearts when the lessons of L'dor va Dor and tzedakah, are blended into activities of enjoyment.

My hope and prayer is for you and your families to always have much for which to be thankful.




